1) Minutes of September 12th, 2024, TSA Board Meeting Motion to approve minutes. Moved. Seconded. Approved.

- 2) Financial Statements
 - Too early in the Month to produce October financials
 - Audit is going smoothly
 - o Large ejection of cash due to Indoor league
 - Auditor wants confirmation of what the money is for before finalizing audit
- 3) Amalgamation NYSA/SSA/TSA
 - TSA awaiting 2023 Audited Financial Statements from North York SA before signing Amalgamation agreement
 - North York SA has sent their books to Auditor
 - Waiting on timeline of when audit should be completed.
 - North York SA is not operational
 - TSA is handling registration and admin work on their behalf
 - 1425 players currently registered
 - o TSA will be invoicing the North York SA clubs for player registration fees
 - Sergi to contact Ontario Soccer to ask for extension on payment to ensure all payments are received.
 - Discussed options if NYSA audit is not completed in a timely manner
 - NYSA were to dissolve, TSA could admit their members
 - TSA board has approved the TSA AGM for December 14th at 9am.
 - Nominations due November 30th

- AGM in place in case NYSA does not provide 2023 audited statements prior to December 14th
- All board members terms have ended, need to elect all positions
 - President, Treasurer, League Director, Registrar 1-year terms
 - Secretary, Vice President, Member at large 2-year terms
- Notice to be sent out as soon as possible
- Audited TSA Financial Statements will be emailed out to all TSA members once available
- Will have 2025 budget finalized within the next 2 weeks
- Fee structure needs to be updated for members to approve at AGM.
 - \$4 increase from Canada Soccer, and Ontario Soccer increase will apply

Motion to approve AGM date. Moved. Seconded. Approved.

4) Reports

- Registration Report
 - Outdoor numbers down from last year
 - Number decreased from last month due to removal of duplicate registrations
 - Indoor numbers are down from last year at this time
 - Teams registered later than usual due to many teams not having a league to play in
 - Recreational players are not currently registered. Should be registered within the next few weeks

• Operations Report

- Grassroots league going well
- 700 teams mean travelling is involved
 - Clubs feel majority of games should be scheduled close to home, however, this is not possible due to the number of teams involved and lack of indoor facility space
- Ontario Soccer has provided special dispensation for the NYSA coaches to coach without being fully certified
 - Special Dispensation given to ensure the players are able to play this indoor season
 - If coaches do not become certified, they will not be approved for the Outdoor season
 - Chrissy and Sergi met with Matt Ferreira to discuss and put plan in place to have all coaches certified for Outdoor 2025
 - Will hold meeting with NYSA and Ontario Soccer representative to discuss coach requirements
 - TSA to hold Fundamentals, Learn to Train, Soccer for Life and Making Ethical Decisions training to assist coaches with their certifications

- TSA will need to work with the NYSA clubs regarding the QSP process
 - QSP process designed to outline minimum expectations for member organizations
 - QSP application requires confirmation of coach certifications (including vulnerable sector police checks) as part of the process
 - QSP is required for teams to participate in leagues
 - Will reach out to NYSA members to have them start the process
- President's Report (including report from OS AGM)
 - Ontario Soccer financial presentation shows financials have recovered from Covid
 - Numbers a little higher than they were pre-Covid
 - Emergency fund is coming along
 - Ontario Soccer will have an inflation increase of a little over 2%
 - TSA should look at adding inflation increases to our fees directly to avoid large increases in future
 - Ontario Soccer looking at having 1 yearly registration fee for players for 2026
 - Would be around \$4 more per youth players, and \$25 more for Senior Competitive
 - Cover indoor and outdoor seasons
 - Larger number of players registered in outdoor, so may be beneficial
 - Would have one registration period per year
 - Ontario Soccer has cancelled their contract with SportsEngine
 - OSCAR will be phased out over the new few years
 - Currently putting out RFPs for new system
 - New system will only handle registrations instead of trying to handle scheduling, referees, ATFs, etc.
 - Ontario Soccer elections held
 - Alan O'Brien elected as Chair of the Board of Directors
 - Dr. Ann Pegoraro re-elected as Independent Director
